24-25 March 2015, African Development Bank, Abidjan

The ECOWAS Centre for Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency (ECREEE), the African Development Bank, the United Nations Industrial Development Organization and GIZ with support of the Spanish Development Cooperation and the Austrian Development Cooperation are organizing a 2 day working meeting/workshop on the Development of the ECOWAS Renewable Energy (RE) and Energy (EE) National Action Plans and Sustainable Energy For All (SE4ALL) Action Agendas, from the 24-26 March 2015 in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire.

The meeting is a follow up activity to the regional Kick-off workshop organized by ECREEE in March 2014 in Abidjan, Cote d'Ivoire, which launched the process of the development of national RE and EE Action Plans and SE4ALL Action Agendas. The aim of this working meeting is to determine the progress made by each country in the development of the action plans, strengthen the capacities of the participants on scenario and target development and to create a platform for representatives of ministries of energy, national consultants, international backstopping experts and ECREEE to closely work together on achieving high quality Action Plans and Action Agendas.

The event will feature the participation of the Directors for Energy in the ECOWAS Member States, the national SE4ALL Focal Points and the national consultants selected in each Member State as well as ECREEE's partners in the implementation of the national action plan process in the ECOWAS region.

Background

In July 2013, the Authority of ECOWAS Heads of State and Government renewed its commitment to the provision of access to sustainable energy services in West Africa by adopting two path-breaking policies - the ECOWAS Renewable Energy Policy (EREP), which aims to increase the share of renewable energy in the region's overall electricity mix to 35% in 2020 and 48% in 2030; and the ECOWAS Energy Efficiency Policy (EEEP), which aims to implement measures that free 2000 MW of power generation capacity and in the long term, more than double the annual improvement in energy efficiency, so as to attain levels comparable to those of world leaders. The policies include a broad range of RE&EE measures to be implemented at regional and national levels, and represent the ECOWAS contribution to the achievement of the Sustainable Energy for All (SE4ALL). Based on a mandate by the ECOWAS authorities to coordinate the implementation of the regional policies as well the SE4ALL Initiative in West Africa, the ECOWAS Centre for Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency (ECREEE) is currently assisting the ECOWAS Member States to develop a coherent and aligned roadmap process.

Within this context, ECREEE has developed a regional framework for the development, implementation and monitoring of the National Renewable Energy Action Plans, National Energy Efficiency Action Plans, and the SE4ALL Action Agenda to ensure attainment of the regional targets by 2020 and 2030 in the ECOWAS Member States.

At a regional workshop organized by ECREEE in March 2014 in Abidjan, Cote d'Ivoire, ECOWAS Member States discussed and adopted the framework for the development and implementation of the regional RE&EE policies and the SE4ALL Action Agendas at the national level. The workshop took place with the active participation of the SE4ALL Africa Hub, and provided an opportunity for the presentation of the Action Agenda template. The Member States have since embarked on the elaboration of their respective national action plans, based on the validated templates and extensive national stakeholders' consultation. To support this process, ECREEE and its partners have provided a team of national and international experts to assist each Member State.

The workshop also comes at the backdrop of the recent SE4ALL Africa Hub organized country action workshop that discussed the aspects of quality assurance of SE4ALL Action Agendas and Investment Prospectuses and the concerted follow-up to AAs/IPs.

The national consultants engaged by ECREEE have since the launch of the process worked extensively and in close collaboration with the Ministries in their various countries to

- Set up intersectorial commitee(s)
- Conduct baselines studies
- Validate baseline data

The ECOWAS countries are now in the process of defining their national targets for renewable energy and energy efficiency as well as energy access.

Key outcomes being sought

- Facilitate the regional exchange and cooperation among the Member States on the Action Plan development process
- Determine the status of national RE and EE Action Plans and the SE4ALL Action Agendas and support country representatives in improving the qualities of the draft NREAPs and NEAPs;
- Provide guidance to country focal points and consultants on the SE4ALL AA process taking into account the latest developments and experiences;
- Discuss and build capacity on the tool that can be used for the development of scenarios as well as NREAP and NEEAP targets.
- Discuss on a possible regional approach and support by ECREEE and partners in the development of an Investment Prospectus based on the action plans.
